The Grand Sovereign



Knight Companion James C. Herndon was elected and installed Most Illustrious Grand Sovereign of the United Grand Imperial Council on June 5, 2010 at Troy, Michigan.

The Grand Sovereign and his wife, Tommye, immediately began visitations to other Masonic bodies and Red Cross of Constantine Conclaves. Tommye's cancer condition worsened. She died on June 26, 2010. The Grand Sovereign has continued the scheduled visitations, but says it is more difficult without his love and traveling companion.

"The tremendous support and fellowship I have received from the Knights Companions and their ladies has been overwhelming," our Grand Sovereign said. "They have supported me with true friendship and brotherly love. I thank everyone for all their prayers, sympathy cards and telephone calls," he said. "I am also very gratified and humbled by being elected your Grand Sovereign. I will carry out my responsibilities to the best of my ability."

Grand Sovereign Herndon was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on July 26, 1941 to John Charles Herndon

and Lucile Terry Herndon. He grew up in Salmon, Idaho where he attended local schools. He graduated valedictorian of Salmon High School in 1959, and received his BA and Juris Doctor degrees from the University of Idaho.

He was married to Tommye R. Low. He has five children, Heidi, Lora, Sarah, Lacrechia and John, and fifteen grandchildren. Daughters Heidi and Lora are Past Honored Queens of Salmon Bethel #34, IOJD of Idaho. Heidi served the Grand Bethel as Grand Inner Guard and Lora as Grand Junior Princess and as Bethel Guardian of Bethel 6, Meridian. Daughter Lacrechia is a Past Honored Queen of Blackfoot Bethel #46 and Son John is a Master Mason and member of Grove City Lodge #33. Tommye served as Guardian of Bethel #46 and was a past grand officer, Grand Guardian Council of Idaho, a Past Matron and Past Secretary of Esther Chapter #14, and a member of Hugh Duncan Chapter #2, Order of the Eastern Star, State of Idaho.

Herndon took over his father's law practice in Salmon, Idaho after his father Charles Herndon's untimely death in an airplane crash while campaigning for Governor of Idaho. He practiced in Salmon for twenty years where he conducted a general civil and criminal law practice with emphasis on litigation. During his years as a private practitioner, Herndon served as Lemhi County Prosecuting Attorney from 1969 to 1973 and from 1983-1985.

Herndon was first elected to the District Court bench in 1987 and served as a trial judge in Idaho's Seventh Judicial District until December 31, 2006. In 1991, he accepted the position of Administrative District Judge for the Seventh Judicial District of the State of Idaho. He held that post for 14 years until retirement. In his term as Administrative District Judge, Herndon supported the establishment of mental health and drug courts in seven counties in the Seventh Judicial District. The courts include adult misdemeanor, felony, juvenile and child protection drug courts with fourteen different judges presiding. Judge Herndon also served as a pro-tem judge on the Idaho Supreme Court from time to time.

Herndon mediated cases for other judges while he was a sitting judge. The "settlement week" he held in the mid 1980s pioneered mediation in Idaho. He has continued to mediate cases since leaving the bench. Herndon is currently a member of the law firm of Pike, Herndon, Stosich & Johnston, and continues to actively support and participate in mediation.

Brother Herndon is an ordained Episcopal Deacon and has served on the Episcopal Diocese of Idaho Standing Committee (President), Diocesan Council and as Dean and Archdeacon of the Eastern Deanery and as Chancellor.

Brother Herndon was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason on December 26, 1962, passed to the Degree of Fellowcraft on May 28, 1963, and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on September 24, 1964 in Lemhi Lodge #11 in Salmon. He was twice Master at Lemhi Lodge #11. He later affiliated as a dual member with Grove City Lodge #33 at Blackfoot, Idaho where he has served four times as Master.

He served as District Deputy of what is now the First Masonic District in 1980/81 and 1981/82. In 1996 he was appointed to the Grand Lodge line as the Worshipful Grand Pursuivant by Grand Master David Olehy and progressed through each of the other offices. He also served twice as Grand Orator. He was elected and served as Grand Master in 2005 - 2006.

The Grand Sovereign comes from a Masonic family. His father, John Charles Herndon, was Past Master of Lemhi Lodge #11 and Grand Master of Masons in Idaho in 1961-62 and active in the York Rite, Shrine and Order of the Eastern Star. Uncle Joe Herndon was Past Master of Lemhi Lodge #11, Past Grand High Priest, Grand Chapter RAM of Idaho and Past Grand Commander, Knights Templar of Idaho. Both his paternal and maternal grandfathers were active Masons. His mother and his Aunt Marjorie were Past Matrons of Hugh Duncan Chapter #2, OES at Salmon.

Companion Herndon received the Royal Arch Degree on February 15, 1967 and is a past High Priest of Salmon Chapter #14, RAM (1973 and 1974) and Idaho Falls Chapter #10, RAM (2002-2003). He was Deputy High Priest, 1st District, 2002-2003; Grand Master of the First Veil, 2004-2005; Grand Master of the Second Veil, 2005-2006; Grand Master of the 3rd Veil, 2006-2007; Grand Royal Arch Captain, 2007-2008 and Principal Sojourner, 2008-2009. He is a member of the Order of High Priesthood.

The Grand Sovereign served as Illustrious Master (2002-2003) of Jeremiah Council #9, Royal and Select Masters at Idaho Falls. In 2004 he was appointed the Grand Sentinel in the Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Idaho, and served as Most Illustrious Grand Master in 2008-2009.

He is a member of the Order of the Silver Trowel and the Council of Thrice Illustrious Masters. He was Thrice Illustrious Master in 2008.

Sir Knight Herndon was created a Knight Templar in 1967 in Salmon Commandery #9, Salmon, Idaho. He is a past commander of Salmon #9 (1974, 1992, 1993, and 1994) and a Past Commander of Idaho Falls Commandery #6, Idaho Falls, Idaho. He was elected Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Idaho and served in 2001. He was invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple (KCT). He was appointed by Sir Knight Richard B. Baldwin, GCT, MEGM, as Department Commander of the Northwest Department for the 2006-2009 Triennium. He was appointed to the Committee on Jurisprudence for the 2009-2012 Triennium. He is a trustee for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. He is a member of St. Bernard Commandery No. 41, Knights Templar stationed at Denver, Colorado.

A member of Boise Valley of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, Jim received the 32nd Degree on April 23, 1977 and was invested with the rank and decoration of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour on November 5, 2005.

The Grand Sovereign was installed on June 10, 1989 in St. Charles Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and Coronated Sovereign in December 1994. He is an honorary member of St. Michael Conclave and St. Patrick Conclave. Jim served as Vice Intendant General, Division of Idaho in 2002; Intendant General, Division of Idaho, 2003-2005; Grand Almoner, 2005-2006; Grand Chancellor, 2006-2007; Grand Junior General, 2007-2008; Senior General 2008-2009 and Grand Viceroy in 2009-2010.

He is a member and an Ambassador in El Korah Shrine, AAONMS. (Boise, Idaho). Jim's other Masonic activities include: Past Sovereign of Fidelity Council No. 277, AMD; a member of the Grand Council, AMD and is a Knight of the Red Branch of Eri. He also belongs to the Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis (SRICF) and holds the IXth Grade. Also the Royal Order of Scotland (Clan Davidson, Idaho); Hugh Duncan Chapter #2, Order of the Eastern Star; Past Associate Grand Guardian, IOJD, Idaho; Advisor and recipient of the Legion of Honor of the Order of DeMolay.

He is a Past Eminent Preceptor of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; Knights of York Cross of Honour (Prior, 2008-2009, Idaho Priory No. 13); Tri-Valley York Rite College #178; the Order of the High Priesthood and an honorary member of the Wyoming Black Horse Troop, Knights Templar of Wyoming; a member of the Past Commanders' Association and the Past Grand Commanders' Association. He is a member of Great Chief's Council No. 0, Knight Masons, USA and the Idaho Chapter, Order of Knights Preceptor; the Sword of Bunker Hill and the Royal and Imperial Order of the Galluses of Alaska.

He is a member of Corinne Lodge #5, F&AM of Utah; Bannack Historical Lodge #3-7-77, AF&AM of Montana, and a life member of the Grand York Rite bodies of Alaska (Anchorage Chapter #3, RAM.; Anchorage Council #1, R&SM; and Anchorage Commander #2, KT).

His other activities include: Member Rotary International; Past Exalted Ruler of Elks Lodge #1620; Past President of North Idaho Chamber of Commerce and Past Director, University of Idaho Foundation.

He is a member of the Seventh District Bar Association and the Idaho Bar Association, a licensed private pilot; member of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA); a certified scuba diver and member of PADI.

In Memoriam

Knight Companion William E. Yeager, Jr., KGC
Grand Sovereign 1995 - 1996
May 12, 1928 – October 7, 2009

William Ellsworth Yeager, Jr. was born in Warren, Pennsylvania. He attended the public schools in Warren graduating from Warren High School in 1946. He graduated from Washington and Jefferson College with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Economics.

Following service in the U.S. Navy he opened the Yeager Insurance Agency, and later associated with his father in the Community Consumer Discount Company of which he was President and Treasurer until his retirement in 1993. He was a member of the First Lutheran Church of Warren and of the Conewango Club. He married the former Shirley M. Herold in 1962 and they had five children.

Bill was made a Mason in Joseph Warren Lodge No. 726 at Warren, Pennsylvania in 1949 and was Master in 1958. He served the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania as Senior Grand Deacon and as Grand Marshal. In 1989 he was appointed District Deputy Grand Master for the 56th Masonic District and served more than seven years in that position.

Companion Yeager served as High Priest of Occidental Royal Arch Chapter No. 235, Thrice Illustrious Master of Bradford Council No. 43, Royal & Select Masters and as Commander of Warren Commandery No. 63, Knights Templar.

Brother Yeager was a member of the Scottish Rite Bodies in the Valley of Coudersport, Pennsylvania. He served as Sovereign Prince in 1960-61 and was coroneted a 33rd Degree Mason in 1964 in Detroit, Michigan.

Bill was a member of the Allied Masonic Degrees, received its Red Branch of Erie and was Sovereign Grand Master and a Knight Grand Cross. Bill was a member of the Chevaliers Bienfaisants de la Cite Sainte and served as Prefect for the Northeast Prefectory 1986-88 and as Great Prior in 1990.

He was a member of Pennsylvania College, Masonic Rosicrucians, served as its Celebrant in 1981 and received the VIII Grade in 1990. Bill was a member of Bethlehem Tabernacle LXXIV, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests and Penn Priory No. 6 of the Knights of the York Cross of Honour. He belonged to Northeastern York Rite College No. 103 and received its Order of the Purple Cross. He also belonged to , the Royal Order of Scotland; the Knight Masons; the Grand College of Rites and National Sojourners

Bill was a Noble of Zem Zem Shrine in Erie, Pennsylvania and served nine years on the Board of Governors of the Erie Shriner's Hospital for Children.

Knight Companion Yeager was elected to membership in Orient Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine at Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania in 1971. He served as Intendant General for the Division of Pennsylvania Central 1985-1991 and was Chairman of the Eastern Regional Assembly from 1985 through 1994. On June 10, 1995 he was elected and installed as Grand Sovereign of the United Grand Imperial Council at the 123rd Annual Assembly held in Jackson, Mississippi.

In the community of Warren, Bill served on many drives and campaigns supporting the needs of the city. He was a member of the Executive Board of Chief Cornplanter Council, Boy Scouts of America and served as Treasurer and Council President for several years. He received the President's Award, the Silver Beaver Award, the James E. West Fellowship and the Cliff Dochterman Award presented by the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians.

Bill organized the rescue division of the Warren County Civil Defense following a disastrous flood in 1956 and the Warren Rescue Squad in 1957. He served as Chief, President and Treasurer for a number of years. From 1974 to 1985 he was a member of the Warren Borough Planning Commission. In 1978 he organized the Warren County Credit Bureau into a user-owned group, which he served as President for several years.

Bill was a Past President of the Warren Rotary Club and served Rotary International as District Governor in 1975-76. He was a Paul Harris Fellow and received a Citation for Meritorious Service from Rotary International "in recognition of his devoted efforts for the furthering of better understanding and friendly relations among people of the world.

In 1996 Bill was awarded the Legion of Honor Bronze Medallion by the Chapel of the Four Chaplains in Valley Forge, Pennsylvania "in recognition of outstanding service to all people regardless of race or faith."

Bill served on the Boards of the Pennsylvania Association of Insurance Agents; the American Industrial Bankers Association; the Pennsylvania Financial Services Association; the Independent Operations Section of the American Financial Services Association and the Pennsylvania Industrial Bankers Association.

From 1948 through 1958 Brother Yeager raced power boats at American Power Boat Association sanctioned regattas throughout the eastern United States and Canada. During this period he won two national championships and two National High Point awards. He was inducted into the Marine Racing Hall of Fame in 1955.

In Memoriam

Knight Companion Frederick H. Lorensen, KGC
Grand Sovereign 2000 - 2001
September 7, 1922 – August 26, 2010

Frederick Howard Lorensen was born in Naugatuck, Connecticut. He attended the public schools in Bristol, Connecticut graduating from Bristol High School in 1940. He received his BA Degree from Wesleyan University, Middletown, Connecticut with a major in mathematics. He was inducted into Sigma Xi Society as a result of his research work. He was a member of Phi Sigma Kappa Fraternity and served as its President

A veteran of World War II, he graduated from navigation school in Selma, Louisiana and served with the 735th Squadron of the 453rd Bomb Group in England as Captain Navigator from May through November 1944. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters. He earned his engineer rating for B-29s and flew out of Randolph Field in Texas before his separation from service in November 1946.

September 24, 1949 Fred married Carolyn Marjorie Darelius of Providence, Rhode Island. Their marriage was blessed with three children and five grandchildren.

Fred worked as a Plant Engineer with the Formatic Company and also with Sylvania Electric in Naugatuck. He founded Metal Mold, Inc. in 1958 and retired in 1988.

Brother Lorensen was raised a Master Mason in Shepherd Lodge No. 78, F&AM in 1956 and served as Master in 1964. He served the Grand Lodge of Connecticut as District Deputy in 1965. He was appointed to the Grand Lodge line in 1975 and served in each station, serving as Grand Master of Masons in Connecticut 1983-84. He served on the Board of the Charity Foundation of Connecticut. He also served as Grand Representative to Kentucky until 1998 when he was appointed Grand Representative of Sweden near the Grand Lodge of Connecticut.

In the York Rite, Companion Lorensen was Exalted in Allerton Chapter No. 19 Royal Arch Masons and later became a member of Cyrus Chapter No. 45. He was greeted in Waterbury Council No. 21, Royal and Select Masters and is now a member of Buel Council No. 20. He was knighted in Clark Commandery No. 7, Knights Templar in Waterbury, served as Commander 1978 - 1980 and continued to serve as a Trustee and as perennial Commander for the Ascension Day services. For his service to Clark Commandery he was made a Knight Crusader of the Cross and was inducted into the Sovereign Order of Knights Preceptor. He was made Knight Commander of the Temple by the Grand Encampment, Knights Templar of the USA.

In the Scottish Rite Valley of Waterbury he was a member of Doric Lodge of Perfection, Ionic Council Princes of Jerusalem and Corinthian Chapter of Rose Croix, serving as Most Wise Master in 1972. A member of Lafayette Consistory, Valley of Bridgeport he served in the line at every station becoming Commander-in-Chief in 1980. Fred was coroneted a 33rd Degree Mason in Boston on September 24, 1975 and was crowned an Active Member of the Supreme Council on September 30, 1981. Serving on committees, he also served as Grand Sword Bearer until 1991 when he was elected Grand Captain General. He also served as the Representative of Belgium near the Northern Jurisdiction Supreme Council. In 1997 he was granted Active Emeritus status.

A member of St. Andrew's Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine of Hartford, Connecticut he served as its Sovereign in 1988. He was appointed Intendant General for Connecticut in 1990-1996. Entering the progressive line he served as Grand Sovereign 2000 - 2001.

Brother Lorensen was proud of his association with the many appendant and concordant Masonic Bodies. In addition to the above he held membership in the Royal Order of Scotland; Connecticut York Rite College No. 17; Pyramid Shriners of Milford, Connecticut; Sphinx Shriners of Newington, Connecticut; Dimaryp Court No. 66 Royal Order of Jesters; the Sovereign Order of Knights Preceptor; the Masonic Veterans of Connecticut, Hartford Chapter No. 56, National Sojourners; William Ledyard Camp, Heroes of '76; Apostle's Tabernacle No. XXVII, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; Great Priory of America, Chevaliers Bienfaisants de la Cite Sainte; Nutmeg Forest No. 116, Tall Cedars of Lebanon, The Philalethes Society; New Jersey Council No. 10, Knight Masons; Connecticut College, Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis; the Royal Ark Mariners, the Masonic Order of the Bath and the Order of Corks.

He was honored by several organizations, receiving the Order of the Purple Cross from the York Rite Sovereign College of North America, the IXth Grade of the Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis; the Honorary Legion of Honor from the Order of DeMolay and the Red Branch of Erie from the Grand Council of the Allied Masonic Degrees.

GRAND ASSEMBLY ATTRACTIONS — Welcome to the City of Trees. Boise is the 208,000-person capital of Idaho, the Gem State, and the Pacific Northwest's third-largest city, and now trails only Seattle and Portland, Oregon. The city's well-loved Greenbelt path runs 25 miles along the shores of the Boise River.
